Citation for the 2019 RAS James Dungey Lectureship: Dr Mark Clilverd

The 2019 RAS James Dungey Lecture is awarded to Dr Mark Clilverd.

Dr Mark Clilverd is a Senior Scientist at the British Antarctic Survey (BAS) and has been since 1990. Dr Clilverd's work has earned him several prestigious accolades: in 1994 he was awarded Outstanding Young Scientist at BAS and, in 1998, the Polar Medal for services to Antarctic Science.

Throughout his career, Dr Clilverd has quietly amassed a world-class reputation in his field. This was not only achieved as a result of authoring over 170 academic papers, but also because of his excellent record of public engagement and outstanding scientific talks on a broad range of space and upper atmospheric topics. His modest, engaging style enables him to successfully deliver talks to audiences containing both professional scientists and amateur enthusiasts. Dr Clilverd's specialist subject can be described as 'Energetic particle precipitation and its effects on the upper atmosphere and climate'.

For these reasons, Dr Mark Clilverd is awarded the James Dungey Lectureship.
